About the Creative Process

Valerie Coleman's <u>Portraits of Langston</u> is a six-movement suite inspired by Langston Hughes's poetry. The Avenue Teen Fellows were given the five dynamic poems Coleman chose, to study and workshop during the audition process. Ultimately, they were each cast to perform the poem that they showed the most kinship to during workshop. Fellows assigned themes and visual elements to their performance to translate into the vision for the vignettes filmed and edited by Dan Gross and directed by <u>Reenah Golden</u>.

Additionally, the genius performance of Avenue Artist-in-Residence <u>Anderson Allen</u> (known creatively as "Poetically Undefined") aptly embraces the single piece of prose, *Le Grand Duc Mambo*.

The Avenue Blackbox's fearless founder, Reenah Golden makes an appearance to pair a performance of the poem, *Go Slow* by Langston Hughes with *Healing*, composed by Rochester's own (and Avenue favorite) <u>Herb Smith</u>.
